# COMMUNICATION SKILLS TRAINING FOR CAREGIVERS DISCUSSING COVID-19 VACCINATION





### TRAINING OVERVIEW

This 90 minute webinar is designed to improve the counseling skills of Massachusetts physicians, nurses, and social workers for discussing COVID-19 vaccination with pregnant and postpartum people. The training will also focus on addressing vaccine hesitancy and reducing racial disparities in rates of COVID-19 vaccination among birthing people and their families.

The webinar is a partnership between the Perinatal-Neonatal Quality Improvement Network of Massachusetts (PNQIN), Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH), and the Center for Integrated Primary Care at UMass Chan Medical School and is part of PNQIN's Perinatal COVID-19 Vaccine Initiative.

# PERINATAL COVID-19 VACCINE INITIATIVE GOALS

- 1. Improve provider capacity for equitable delivery of SARS-CoV-2 vaccination to pregnant and postpartum people and their families;
- 2. Increase the number of birth facilities with protocols for SARS-CoV-2 screening and vaccination provision for pregnant and postpartum people and their families; and
- 3. Increase the number of pregnant and postpartum people with clinical-community linkages in response to SARS-CoV-2.
